The Nellie Wakeman Fellowship is a \$6000 to \$7500 award jointly sponsored by the American Foundation for Pharmaceutical Education (AFPE) and Kappa Epsilon Fraternity. It was established in 1957 to encourage outstanding Kappa Epsilon members to pursue an advanced degree in a college of pharmacy graduate program in the pharmaceutical sciences.

Howard University's Alpha Pi Chapter Hosts Breast Cancer Awareness Brunch

"It was about not losing hope," said Joan Oboite, about her triumph over breast cancer. Oboite, who works in radiology and oncology at Howard University Cancer Center, was a featured speaker at the first annual Breast Cancer Awareness Brunch, held on September 25, 2010 in the Blackburn Art Gallery at Howard University.

Jasmine Carpenter, a 3rd year Howard Pharmacy Student and Kappa Epsilon member, envisioned and organized the event. Breast Cancer awareness is a yearly project for her fraternity. Carpenter had a simple but remarkable approach. She decided to organize the brunch to benefit those on a local level. "The Cancer Center is right here at Howard. Why not help Howard?" said Carpenter.

Dr. Daphne Bernard, Assistant Dean and Professor of Howard University School of Pharmacy opened the program with a poem about breast cancer. The featured speakers were three breast cancer survivors, including Oboite, Juone Darko and Jacque Perry. Also, a physician, Dr. Gladys Onojobi, a Howard University Cancer Center specialist, enlightened the audience with risk factors, treatment options, as well as interesting findings

concerning breast cancer and race. She explained how some Caucasian women with a family history of breast cancer have become more proactive, by having their breasts removed and reconstructed early. Onojobi, also informed the audience of proper time to perform self-breast examinations, which is ideally once monthly following menstruation.

Historically, African American women have often been diagnosed with more aggressive forms of breast cancer that may not be amenable to current treatment, while others do not seek treatment until the cancer has progressed, due to many factors including less access to health care.

Through this project, Carpenter and Kappa Epsilon are working to impact these issues. The funds raised will go towards providing free mammograms for women that are younger than 40, as there is a need for earlier screening in some patients, and grant monies are not designated to cover that age group. Kappa Epsilon raised the funds through raffles, and ticket sales, and corporate sponsors for the brunch included Rite Aid, and Wal-Mart.
